Name of Program: Peer Education

Program Description:

The Peer Education Program is a peer preventative education program that works with youth to tackle different social issues. This unique program empowers youth to share information about social issues with their peers and provide information and tools to help them make healthy decisions.

Collingwood Neighbourhood House's (CNH) Peer Education Program is looking for young adults to take on mentorship roles for school-aged youth. The Peer Mentor is expected to be involved with the Program from August 2018 to April 2019. From January-April 2019, the mentor oversees after school sessions of the program for 3 hours a week, for roughly 15 weeks total with a conference style fair to wrap up the program.

Location: Renfrew-Collingwood Neighbourhood and Collingwood Neighbourhood House

Position Overview: Duties:

- The role will involve working closely with a group of high school and grade 7 students from the Renfrew-Collingwood neighbourhood. The mentor will facilitate a weekly after school youth group alongside the support of program coordinators, other staff, and volunteers.
- The mentor should be someone who is passionate about working with youth, while learning about and tackling different social issues in the community.

The mentor's main task is to provide guidance for a small group to research on a chosen social issue; ideally the mentor will be passionate about 3 topics and have some general knowledge on them. They will support the youth to develop a workshop to showcase at an annual fair in May. Past years topics include: Bullying, online safety, body image, substance abuse, mental health, LBGTQ2 and more.

Volunteer Qualifications:

- Understanding of how to work within an anti-oppressive framework.
- Knowledge of youth experiences and resources in the Renfrew-Collingwood
- Ability to lead and facilitate weekly after school sessions.
- Education and work experience in areas such as social work, psychology, social justice, and youth empowerment training is an asset.

Honoraria will be awarded at the end of the program as a thank you for the mentor's commitment. Other bonuses include: enthusiastic references and a sense of connection and accomplishment. ©
